OTHER PROVISIONS NECESSARY FOR DEFINITION OR ADMINISTRATION OF THIS WATER RIGHT:

of suppressing wildfires. This water right shall not be used as a basis to prevent
the future appropriation of water.

This partial decree is subject to such general provisions necessary for the
definition of the rights or for the efficient administration of the water rights as
may be ultimately determined by the Court at a point in time no later than the entry
of a final unified decree. Idaho Code § 42-1412(6).

upon which execution may issue and an appeal may be taken as provided by the Idaho Appellate Rules.



 National Forests in Idaho and the Kaniksu, Lolo and Kootenai NF in Montana


